School Dinners

To clarify, Years EYFS, 1 and 2 are in receipt of Universal Free School Meals. Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 can have a school meal, however, this is at a cost of $\pounds 2.35$ per day, from the Autumn Term.

Can we please remind everyone to book their dinners via Pay360 by Saturday lunchtime – thank you.



Please make sure that children have plenty of layers on whilst at school to keep them warm as we do have to keep the school very well ventilated even in the cold weather. There is nothing worse than being cold during the day as this does not help their learning.

SIMs App

Please make sure that you keep your SIMs Parent App up to date through your App store to ensure that you continue to receive messages.

As you are aware, we are a paperless school and all messages are sent home via this technology.

We have recently been lucky enough to be able to purchase some lovely new reading books to support Literacy throughout school. It is important that these books go home with the children so that they continue to read at home with their parents/carers support.

Attendance

We have recently seen a marked increase in the number of children who are being taken out of school/leaving early due to Dentist and Doctors' appointments.

Can we please remind parents/carers that it is a legal requirement for children to be in school for the entire school day and we respectfully ask that appointments are kept to a minimum (unless in an emergency) as these absences significantly impact on your children's learning. In addition, if your child leaves school during the day due to an appointment, we are legally required to record this absence in case there is an unexpected need for evacuation.

This will again be recorded on the register which will impact on their attendance percentage. Even if they arrive at school to be recorded when the register is taken in the morning, if they then leave at any point during the day, they will be recorded as absent for the time they are off site.

In addition, can we remind everyone that the school day starts at 8.50am and any children arriving after this time will be given a late mark. We are again seeing a significant increase in children arriving late and this is recorded on your child's record accordingly.

Please be aware that all attendance for all children is closely monitored by the County Attendance team. We appreciate that there is sometimes a need to have an emergency appointment, however, may we thank you for your support in this matter.

Trips/Events

Some great trips have taken place this half term with Year 6 going to Warning Zone, Year 3 went to the Leicester Museum and Art Gallery, the School Choir entertained the residents of Howe Court in Whitwick, Year 5 were entertained by 'Abbey Ayre and the Shed of Science' and Years 5 and 6 enjoyed their Bikeability week.
