As you will be aware, we place high emphasis on good attendance and the impact that absence can have on children's progress and general education.

We wanted to clarify that if a child is unwell they should not come to school. We completely understand that children pick up all sorts of bugs and infections and, in those cases, we would wish them to be at home so that they can recover fully.

The matter relating to holidays being taken during Term Time is entirely different. We enjoy lengthy holidays during the school year and we actively discourage family holidays being taken during the remaining 38 weeks. The Department of Education and LCC stipulate that family holidays during term time will result in a Fine. We are obliged to strictly adhere to the guidance we receive from LCC as we are maintained by them. We recognise that costs vary hugely in term time and during school holidays, however, the impact on your children's education cannot be underestimated. Thank you for your support in this matter.

As a reminder, please it is important that our Absence Policy is adhered to if your child is absent ie.

• ensure their child attends school every day the school is open except when a statutory reason applies;

• notify the school as soon as possible when their child has to be unexpectedly absent through sickness. In this case, parents/carers must call the school absence line as early as possible on 01530 832656 and provide details of the child's name and the reason for absence. If we do not receive contact from you, due to Safeguarding obligations, we will make a home visit and the matter be referred to social care;

• only request leave of absence in exceptional circumstances and do so in advance. Exceptional circumstances do not include holidays, family events, birthdays etc. We completely understand that booking holidays in term time has a financial impact, however, please do not underestimate the impact this time away from school has on your child's education. We would appreciate your honesty in reporting this absence so that we can use the correct coding;

• book any medical appointments around the school day where possible.

In order to provide continuous monitoring of children's attendance, Mrs Smith, our Attendance Officer in school, will contact families where we have identified a concern about the level of absence or where a pattern of absence has been detected.

• Absence will also consider children who arrive persistently late. Once again, I would like to clarify that school starts at 8.45am and the registers close at 9.00am. If your child has to press the buzzer to gain access to school, this means that they are late and will receive a late mark which will impact on their attendance percentage.


• If you remove your child from school during the day to attend a medical appointment, for safeguarding reasons, they are signed out of school (and back in, if appropriate), this will also show as an absence (as they have been out of school for that period of time).

• If you remove your child from school due to a family holiday, this will be recorded as unauthorised. On their return to school, you will be provided with all the learning material that was missed during this period of absence and there will be an expectation for this to be completed and returned, in full, by the end of their first week back for marking and recording purposes.

Following the changes to the guidance around C-19 isolation, we do not expect to be absence associated with this to be a problem (although to date this has been recorded as an authorised absence). We will continue to report your child's absence percentage to you at the end of each half term which will be based on the following criteria:

o 99% and above (excellent) o 95 - 99% (good) o 90 - 94% (poor) o Below 90% (persistent absentee).

As of today, our school's attendance percentage for the year to date is 97% which, based on the above criteria, is GOOD.



You will recall that we welcomed the Book Fair into School in October. This is always a very popular visitor to school and one that supports our insatiable need for new and interesting books for the children.

Through your purchasing power we took over $\pounds750$ which is incredible. As a result of this, the reward total that we accrued amounted to $\pounds350$ which we can spend on new books across school. Huge thanks to everyone!
