

SEND Pupil Questionnaire 2024 Highlights

In June 2024 children on the school SEND register were asked about our school. 100% responded.

100% said they strongly agree or agree they are happy at school.

100% said that they feel included at New Swannington Primary School.

100% said that they feel safe at school.

89.7% said they knew how well they were doing at school.

When asked if their school work was interesting:

17% said they strongly agree

45% said they agree

38% said they were neutral

100% said they had been offered after school clubs with 83% attending a club.

100% said that they could and would ask for help if they needed it.

97% said the adults working with them in school knew what they found difficult and how to help them.

100% agree that staff treat them fairly.

100% agreed there was someone they could go to if they had worries.

Our next steps

1. Develop the role of subject leaders in school so that:
 - All subject areas identify how SEND is supported through the development of a subject area SEND provision and adaptations document.
 - All subject leaders have an understanding of how SEND is supported and taught in their subject area.
 - All subject leaders have an understanding of SEND progress in their subject .

2. Further develop our curriculum to ensure interest and engagement for all pupils.

OFSTED in July 2024 noted in their report that "One pupil, whose comments were typical of many, said, 'Nobody is ever left out here; there is always someone to play with.' Pupils say that they feel safe in school. They trust staff to help them if they have any worries. "
