

Phonics Home Learning Activities 11.5.20-15.5.20

Here are some suggested activities to support your child's Phonics and Literacy learning. The activities can be done in any order.

Practise phonemes - **oa**, **ow**, **oi**

Learn the tricky word - **some**

Everyday or as often as possible

Recap the letters and sounds the children know so far. You could use the sound mats handed out in their home learning packs or you could use these videos to help:

Handwriting activity

Be a Handwriting Hero and practise writing letters from the curly caterpillar family. There are a lot of letters in this family so we will practise half this week and half next week. Watch Betty the Bear demonstrate how to write these letters on the YouTube page. You could practise writing the letters using pens/pencils, wet paint brushes on paving stones, in trays of sand or rice... anywhere you can make a mark!

Tricky word activity



Sight Word puddle jumping

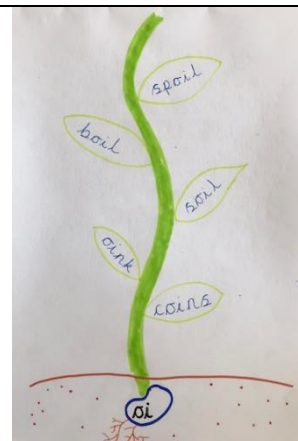
Practise your tricky words - he, she, we, me, be, all, you, her, was, they, my, are, said. Then look at the new tricky word some. Write your tricky words onto cards (do it by yourself or a grown up could help). Lay out the cards like puddles on the floor. Ask your grown up to say one of the words and see if you can jump into the correct puddle!

Reading activity

Practise the digraphs (2 letters making 1 sound) **oa**, **ow** and **oi**. Make your own noughts and crosses board using the sounds. Say the sound before you put your counter down. If your child needs more challenge, write words with the sounds in e.g. goat, float, cow, shower, coin, soil.

Writing activity



Watch Miss Wilman tell the story of "Jack and the Beanstalk" on our YouTube channel. Grow your own phonics beanstalks using "oa", "ow" and "oi". Draw or cut out 3 different beanstalks like in the photo. Add leaves with words including the same phonemes e.g. for the oi beanstalk you could write **coins**, **soil**, **boil**...
