Children will name and discuss different types of feelings and emotions.. They will learn and use strategies or skills in approaching challenges and name and recognise how healthy choices can keep us well.


Art/Design and Technology Graffiti Art


Summer Term 2022 Curriculum Fact Sheet



Science

Light

Children will recognise that light travels in straight lines to explain that objects are seen because they give out or reflect light into the eye. They will explain that we see things because light travels from light sources to our eyes or from light sources to objects and then to our eyes. Finally they will use the idea that light travels in straight lines to explain why shadows have the same shape as the objects that cast them.



History WW2



Understanding the significance of the Blitz and events leading up to it, similarities and differences between locations affected by the Blitz in their locality and comparable events experiences by Britain's enemies. children will develop their narrative of the people and places involved in the war. This is achieved by getting them to reflect on their perceptions when they respond to new information and a range of historical sources.



Computing Networks

Children will have the opportunity to find out more about how networks work, understand computer networks including the Internet, learn how they can provide multiple services, such as the World Wide Web, and explore the opportunities they offer for communication and collaboration



Music Music Tech

Children will learn about a wide variety of musical sections and how these can be used to form musical structure. They hear and identify sections in pre-recorded songs from a variety of genres. They use Bandlab to create backing tracks before writing raps and body percussion rhythms over them.
