**Monday 15<sup>th</sup> June** – Whistle with grass (Use a thick blade of grass between your thumbs).

**Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> June** – Sketch up close (Find something interesting to draw like a leaf or flower. Get even closer by using a magnifying glass or a camera to zoom in).

**Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> June** – Plan a nature quiz. (Write some questions about wildlife. You could email your quiz for the children at school to have a go at).

**Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> June** – Spot a wild animal! (It could be a squirrel, a bird, a wild rabbit... If you struggle to find any animals near your house, check out a wild webcam. Maybe you could even stay up until dusk to see the badger webcam).

**Friday 19<sup>th</sup> June** – Scatter seed bombs! (Throw seeds and soil in hard to reach places and see what grows!)

**Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> June** – Keep a note of wildlife. (Keep a list of animals you see from your window or garden.)

**Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> June** – Google wild facts. (Discover facts about your favourite animal.)
